- Mentoring, coaching, or running clinics for younger athletes.
- Including classmates who otherwise feel excluded. Like Joe Ehrmann says, "No one eats alone."
- Getting involved with anti-bullying activities.
- Supporting other classmates' activities by showing up and cheering them on. This works best at events few attend, like junior varsity games.
- Participating in community service activities as a team or on your own.

List what you, your team, or you and a group of teammates can do this season to make a positive contribution to your school community.
Create an action plan. As you do, talk to your coach. Bring this topic up at a team meeting. Involve teammates. You'll make a bigger impact with more people involved. Then follow through and make it happen.
